Description:

An evaluation or a review is useful to assess current progress toward an objective.

Quite often this review is conducted by a design instructor, or a review panel of experts who provide feedback on the quality of our work and how to improve it. Very rarely are we required to evaluate ourselves on the quality of our own work, because we focus on the deliverables required to meet the midterm presentation deadline for drawings, models, etc.

This evaluation will be a self-review of the learning at the end of the semester. It will also allow for information you wish to convey to the instructor separate from your performance on the graded assignments and quizzes.

Your final learning evaluation will cover your progress on the learning outcomes as stated in the syllabus.

Requirements:

For each of the learning outcomes listed in the syllabus, provided a concrete example of how you have demonstrated the learning outcome. (Just saying “I know” or “I comprehend” is not an example.)

One suggestion is to find a project design that you did not produce and to graphically load trace and identify live and dead loads (without numerical values), identify the material and design process, and how the structure affects the architecture within the context of design variables. (Every learning outcome must be addressed.)

In addition the final learning evaluation must be submitted in electronic format, either in Microsoft Word, WordPerfect, RTF, PDF, PostScript, HTML, or plain text format, for evaluation by Turnitin.com (in eCampus).

Optional:

Once you have completed the requirements, you may add any additional information that you think may be of value if your final term grade is just below a grade cut off.

The material must be concise to warrant a review. In addition, any reworked assignments or quizzes or new work submitted may or *may not* be reviewed.

Evaluation Criteria:

Your final evaluation will be evaluated over the following:

1. Completeness (60%)
 - a. Have you provided concrete examples for all the learning outcomes?
2. Depth of reflection (40%)
 - a. Are your answers honest or flippant?
